The Bossa Nova Beatniks were born in Greenwich Village in Manhattan over twenty years ago. They have recorded over a dozen CD's and have enjoyed radio play all over the world. The Bossa Nova Beatniks are in the studio working on a new CD. Writer, producer, singer Tom Gould decided that the time was right get out of the studio and take the music to the street.

Gould will be singing songs from the "Danger Bongo Crossing" CD as well as trying out some of the new tracks from the upcoming CD and exploring many tracks from his long career. Tabacco said, "It's really just rock 'n' roll with a cool vibe.
